Mozart's Requiem – conducted by Khun Somtow Sucharitkul

The Mountbatten Cantata – conducted by Trisdee na Patalung

Mozart died in 1772 before his Requiem was completed. It is generally accepted that the final segment of the Requiem written by him was the Lacrimosa. Our performance of the Requiem will conclude at that point, a poignant reminder of the unfinished lives of those who have been victims of terrorism.

The Mountbatten Cantata was composed by Khun Somtow Sucharitkul in 2009 to celebrate the 25th Anniversary of the creation of the Mountbatten Institute. The text of the Cantata is based on a series of five poems by the Indian Nobel Laureate, poet and philosopher, Rabindranath Tagore. They deal with change and the effects of life's journey on the individual. The year 2011 marks the 150th anniversary of the birth of Tagore.

This concert, organized by the Mountbatten Institute to honour those who were victims of 9/11 and of all victims of terrorism, also reflects on the 27 years of the Mountbatten Institute's work in developing Anglo American and intercultural understanding through its business training programmes in New York and London.

Scholarship Fund, and the British Garden at Hanover Square, New York.
